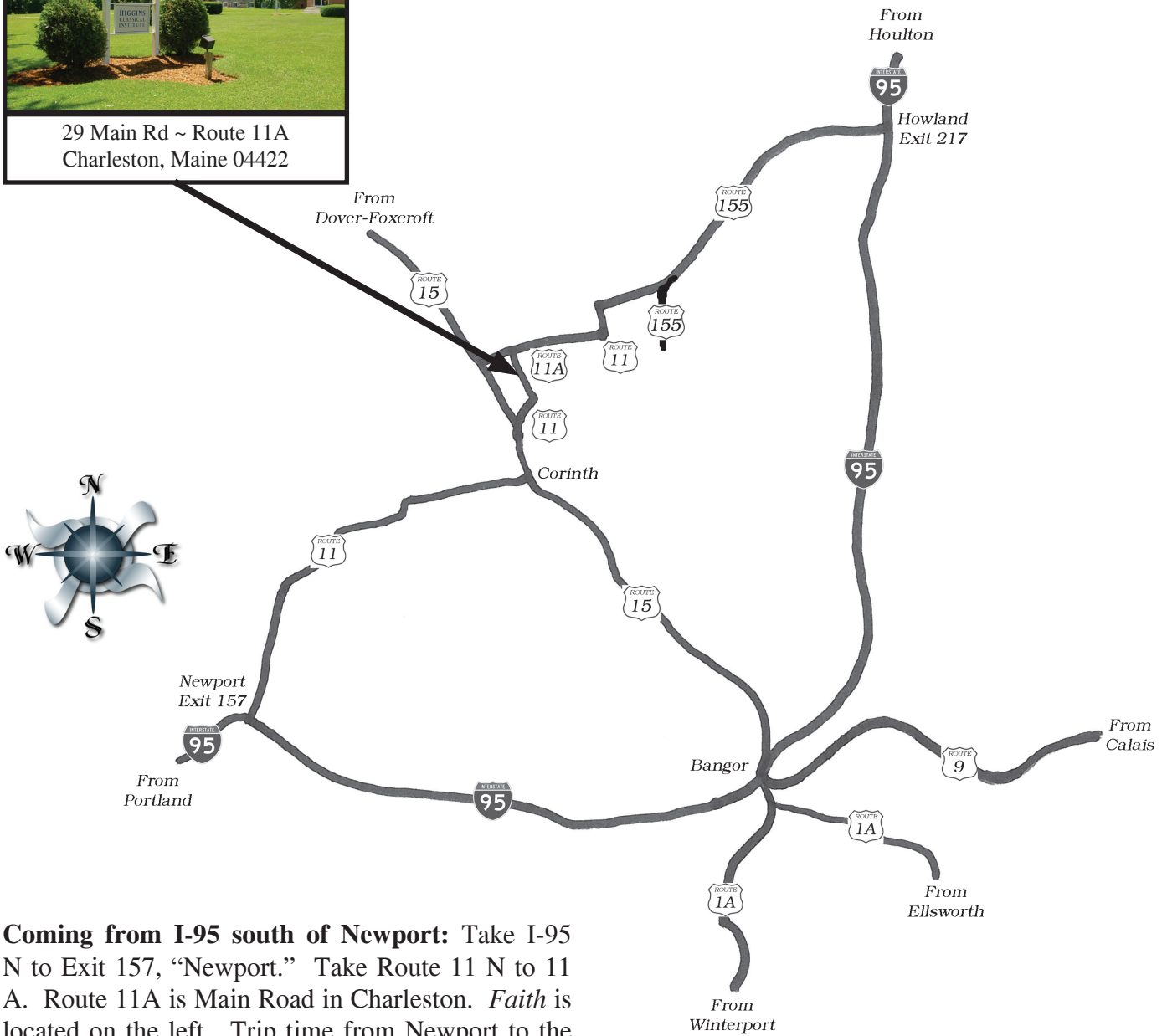


# Directions to *Faith*



**Coming from I-95 south of Newport:** Take I-95 N to Exit 157, “Newport.” Take Route 11 N to 11 A. Route 11A is Main Road in Charleston. *Faith* is located on the left. Trip time from Newport to the school is approximately 35 minutes.

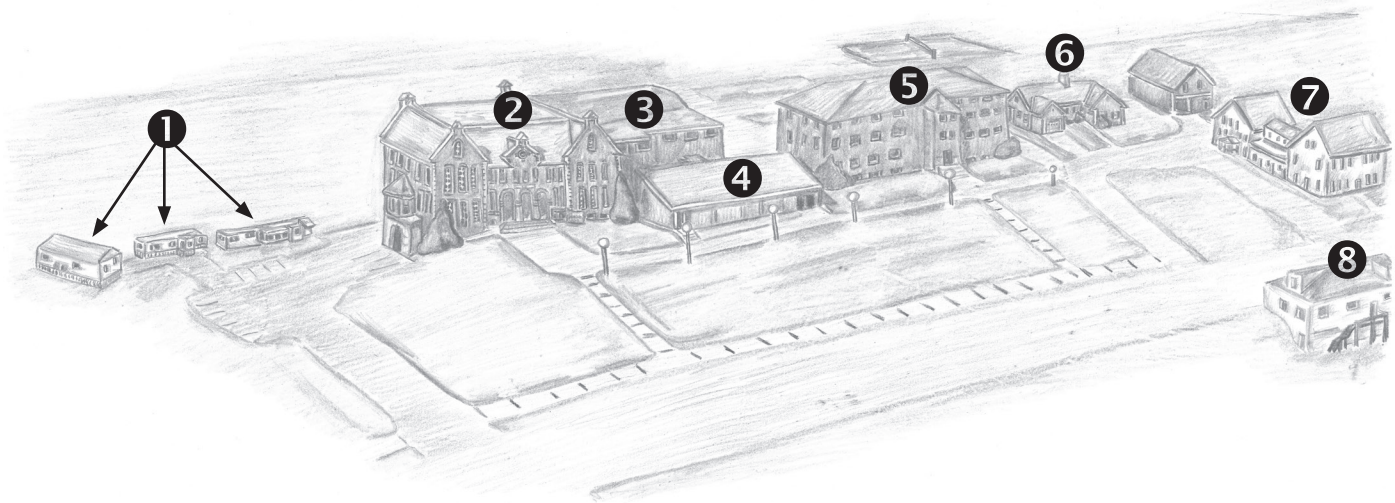
**Coming from I-95 north of Howland:** Take I-95 S to Exit 217, “Howland.” Take Route 155 S to 11 S to 11A. After turning onto Main Road in Charleston, *Faith* will be on your right. Trip time from Howland to the school is approximately 30 minutes.

**Coming from Bangor:** Take Route 15 N (Broadway) to Route 11 N just across the Charleston town line. Route 11 N will become 11 A. Route 11A is Main Road in Charleston. *Faith* is located on the left. Trip time from Bangor to the school is approximately 35 minutes.

## ***Mission & Method***

*Faith's* purpose is to Mentor students for Spirit-filled leadership in Ministry, in light of the Great Commission.

*Faith* is not an ordinary school. While academics are important, the classrooms are not the only learning place. Through a combination of formal instruction, chapel services, practical experience, personal interaction, and discipleship, *Faith* aims to develop the inner man. *Faith's* purpose is to produce Spirit-filled leaders with a ministry followed by the signs of Mark 16.

At *Faith*, the Bible is the chief textbook and Jesus is the sovereign Lord. Special emphasis is placed upon the student's relationship with God and the sanctifying process which occurs in the believer's heart. A constant spirit of revival pervades the atmosphere. The name of Jesus Christ is magnified. The Holy Spirit is invited to interrupt the daily routine at any time.

## ***Objectives***

Upon successful completion of three years, the *Faith* graduate should

- be knowledgeable and articulate in Bible doctrines.
- be effective as a Gospel communicator, whether one-on-one or in a group setting.
- be developing in the operation of the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

## ***Admission Requirements***

- Age 17 or older
- Born-again Christian
- References demonstrating Christian character
- Reasonably sound health

## ***Admission Procedure***

An application packet is included at the end of this catalog. Detailed instructions are given. The applicant will be notified by mail concerning the status of his application.

## ***Nondiscriminatory Policy***

*Faith* does not discriminate against members, applicants, students, and other on the basis of race, color, or national or ethnic origin.

## ***Divorced Persons***

Certain limitations and conditions may apply in the admission of persons who have been divorced. Criteria will be determined by the Administration.

## ***Endorsements***

- *Faith* is incorporated as a non-profit religious institution and is registered with the Secretary of the State of Maine.
- *Faith* is recognized by a number of Bible colleges that accept *Faith* credits.
- *Faith* is authorized under Federal law to enroll nonimmigrant alien students.
- *Faith* is approved by the State of Maine State Approving Agency for eligible veterans and dependents under various educational assistance programs.
- *Faith* is authorized to grant the Evangelical Training Association (ETA) diploma to students who qualify.
- *Faith* is an approved Berean Study Center.

“Pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 10708, subsection 4, this institution is not required to obtain authorization from either the State Board of Education or the Maine State Legislature in order to: (1) use the name “junior college,” “college,” or “university,” (2) offer courses or programs for academic credit, or (3) confer degrees”

## *Dress Code*

A detailed description of the dress code is clearly outlined in the Student Handbook (sent upon acceptance to *Faith*). Some general guidelines are given below.

The guiding principles used to govern appearances at *Faith* are modesty, neatness, and appropriateness. Students are to avoid the latest fashion extremes.

**Church Attire:** To Friday night chapel services, and Sunday services, students wear dress clothes, consisting of jacket and tie for men and dressy skirts/blouses/sweaters or dresses for the ladies. The same attire is required for weekday chapels except the gentlemen are not required to wear jackets. (Dresses/skirts must reach the bottom of the knee.)

**Class Attire:** Men will wear dress slacks and dress shirts. Ladies may wear dress slacks/skirts with blouses or dresses.

**Casual & Relaxed Attire:** At most other times, students are free to dress less formally. Again, principles of modesty are maintained.

**General:** Simple jewelry and makeup is permitted. Men must maintain neat, tapered haircuts. Ladies' hair must be conservative and feminine at all times.

## *Alternative Dispute Resolution*

We believe that Faith School of Theology has all the resources necessary to resolve personal disputes that may arise among its officers, faculty, staff, board members, agents and students. Faith School of Theology has chosen an alternative dispute resolution (ADR), including the use of arbitration (see the Student Handbook for our established Procedures for Arbitration), to resolve conflict in lieu of going to court. We do not believe that Christians are free to make demands, threaten, sue or actually litigate any matter among themselves. To do so would be in clear violation of the Biblical prohibition contained in I Corinthians 6:1-8 which, as a part of our faith, we are commanded to obey. We have agreed to waive any legal right to take non-criminal disputes to a court of law. We have agreed to submit any and all non-criminal disputes, differences and controversies whatsoever, that any party continues to contest after the Matthew 18 principals have been applied, to binding arbitration.
